

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
About the course

Qualitative research methods serve to explore the grey areas that remain outside the confines of quantitative predictive research in human behavior. Training in qualitative research is absolutely essential to understand and explore the dynamic nature of the society in which we function. This course introduces students to qualitative research and helps them understand how qualitative research supplements quantitative inquiry in human behavior and the social sciences.

So what will happen is that will discuss what Qualitative research is, the course is, you know going to talk about something that is not discussed very much in the Indian settings, by the Indian academia. Now qualitative research methods serve to explode the grey areas that remain outside the confines of quantitative predictive research in human behavior. qualitative research is more exploratory and training in qualitative research is absolutely essential to understand and explore the dynamic nature of the society, in which we function.

So this course introduces you all, the students, the listeners to qualitative research and helps you all understand, how qualitative research supplements quantitative enquiry in human behavior and social sciences. What qualitative research does that quantitative research cannot do and that is what we will be talking about in this course.


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And what we will study, is we are going to study various things in the first week, we are going to talk about introduction to qualitative research, we will discuss, you know this is the introductory lectures, so this is this lecture one introduction, the qualitative researchers, we talk about what qualitative researchers do. We will also discuss the differences between qualitative and quantitative research.


We will talk about how qualitative research came to be where it is today and we will talk about the process of qualitative research, what does it tell, what do you need to do as a qualitative researchers, what kind of situation to explore etc. So all that will be covered in the first week.

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Then in the second week, second and third week, we will talk about major paradigms and perspectives, so we will be talking about some dominant paradigms, we will talk about Interpretivism, Constructivism, Verstehen and we will talk about critical theory, we will talk about the critics of critical theory etc. Now the way this is going to be is will have one light week and one heavy week and one light week and one heavy week that is how is structured this.

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Then in the fourth and fifth week, we will discuss strategies of enquiry, we will talk about what Qualitative Enquiry is, we will talk about Qualitative research design, will discuss specific strategies, which is including Ethnography, Autoethnography, Case Studies, Analyzing interpretive practice, Grounded Theory and Participatory Action Research for the most part. These are the things that we will talk about in the fourth and fifth weeks.


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In the sixth and seventh weeks, we will talk about the Methods of collecting and analyzing empirical materials, so we will talk about Observations, how do you conduct observation. Interviewing, what are the aspects of interviewing, how does interviewing shape up. Interpretation of documents and material culture, how and what, how do you interpret documents and physical things, material culture, material tangible aspects of reality.

We will talk about Images and visual method; we will also talk about Autoethnography, personal narratives and reflexivity, which is, you know reviewing, what one has done. We will also talk about, how you Analyze talk and text and then we will start winding up the discussion on Data management and analysis methods and then we will also talk about how Software plays a role in quality research, how you can use software for qualitative research.

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Then we will, in the last week of the course, we will talk about Interpretation, evaluation and presentations. We will talk about The problem of criteria, we will talk about Interpretation, we will talk about Writing, we will talk about Evaluation and social programs, we will talk about Qualitative research and social policy and then we will talk about the, we will conclude the discussion, by reviewing whatever we have done.

Now we will discuss how Qualitative research is interpreted, we will talk about how Qualitative research is presented, what are the concerns, what are the opportunities of ordered by the scores, et cetera. So that will be done, that will be dealt with, in week eight.

Now what do we expect from students? We expect you to listen to the lecturers very clearly, we expect you to contribute, we would encourage you to contribute on the forum that is meant for this purpose. Please think about whatever you have heard, post your questions, post your queries, talk about, you know discuss ideas that generate some interest, discuss ideas that stimulate your imagination and then say ok. Why this, can I know more about this? can I know more about that? Etc.

- A complete summary of the entire field of qualitative research

Now what this course is not about, this course is not prescriptive; this course will not give you, step-by-step instructions on how to do things. That is not what this course is aimed at. This course is not a substitute for a standardized text book on qualitative research methods; that is not something this course will do. This course is not a complete summary of the entire field of qualitative research; this course is not aiming to tell you everything there is, to know about qualitative research.

This course is only meant as an overview of the field of qualitative research. The idea here is to stimulate enough interest, is used to stimulate enough curiosity, in the minds of the students, in the minds of the listeners, so that they can take whatever is discussed here and go and explore some more. So if you know the number of questions on the forum will really help us understand how successful we have been as teachers or as you know, some how successful I have been in stimulating your interest in this very, very interesting, very enriching field of qualitative research methods.

And that is something that we will really look forward to, please post your questions, I promise you your questions will be answered within a reasonable amount of time to the best of our ability.
