And this is your very first session, and I hope that the people who have signed up are engaged in some sort of research, that is going on some kind of research or they are planning to enroll for some sort of research activity. Now for this this particular course has been specifically designed to help budding, and existing researchers with their writing with the documents the research documents, that they produce that the you know the research writing is a skill that is used by researchers across disciplines.


So, the way you write research the formatting may differ from discipline to discipline, but the reasons for writing research do not differ they are pretty much the same. Course and research writing is compulsory for research students in many universities, and institutes of higher education like the IITs here, it is called English for technical writing, and the so, the research writing is an integral component of that course.

I have developed and taught this course here for about 3 and a half years, and I have found that you know I got inputs from different disciplines, and I realized that it was very very essential for researchers to understand why we were writing, and how to present their work in a way that it would be appreciated in the academic community. And what I also realized in my interactions with other colleagues in other universities, and institutes was that many people, in who are actually actively engaged in research have not had a chance to undergo specific training in research writing, they learn through observation they learn to discussions etcetera. So, that was the need for designing this course.

Now, this is an introductory session in which I will just tell you this course is all about, and what my expectations are this course is like all my previous courses is not prescriptive; however, I will try to give you some pointers on, how to write research papers, how to write research documents, why they should be written, what should be

included, what should not go into these research documents. The four things that we will cover in this course are.

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The 4 weeks that we will have are just a second yeah. So, what and wow why of week one will be, what and why of technical and research writing.

Week 2 will be a specific module devoted to literature reviews how do you do literature reviews, what do you write, how do you get them together and you know writing in general, and specifically writing literature, the reviewing literature specifically. then week four we will focus on writing about methods results and discussion of results, and week 4 we will focus on referencing academic integrity, and writing for different types of readers.

And so, we will discuss the different kinds of documents. Now depending on the feedback that I receive from you or depending on the discussions that we engage in on the portal, we might I might shift things around a little bit or might even include newer things that are necessary for your course. So, you know we have that kind of flexibility at the IIT Kharagpur. So, I hope that we will be able to do that.

So, I welcome you to this course now my expectations are that you will, I will help you know I will give you some exercises. I will not be evaluating these exercises, but I will tell you how you can practice whatever you have learnt in this class at home, and I would

encourage discussion on the forum, please be active on the forum, please ask me questions, please discuss whatever you have learnt, please ask each other, you know please ask your pears, who are doing research in fields other than yours or distinctly different than yours, and then get their inputs and get you know and try and understand how research writing takes place.

So, and ask me questions about whatever we have discussed, and also help each other add to the knowledge base with that is what is expected of you. I will try and make this as interactive as possible in terms of discussions, mostly discussions it is not prescriptive they will be pointers, if you have a better method of doing something, or a more convenient, or a more comfortable, or a more technologically appropriate method of doing something, please share it with everybody else on the forum, and we will go to build a knowledge as we grow.

So, that is my expectation now your examinations, all your quizzes will be online, and your final examination will be online. It they will be all be multiple choice type questions. So, I would expect you to understand, and learn things, as we go along. And if you have any questions, we will be active on the forum and we will be there to respond to you.

So, that is what this course is all about, and I hope you really enjoy this course. And I welcome you to this course; we will start the discussion from the next session onwards.
